





Keeping Kids On Course 2020 a Summer of Opportunity for Programming

As we began planning for this year's summer programming, First Tee – Southeast Wisconsin understood the impact that the COVID-19 crisis was having on kids throughout our community. Regularly scheduled youth sports camps and programs were having to make major adjustments to their programming and, in many cases, were forced to cancel summer sessions completely. Golf found itself in a unique position to be able to adjust in-person programming in the safest way possible for our children with little impact to its delivery. We knew that youth golf programming would be more crucial than ever this summer.

At the same time, we recognized the impact that the pandemic was having on many household budgets throughout our community. Families had to prioritize their needs to adjust to financial changes, impacting the amount of money available for youth activities this summer.

Thanks to your support, we were able to respond to these challenges by offering our Pre-PLAYer and PLAYer (introductory level) sessions free of charge for all kids who signed up to participate in programming held at our Noyes Park location. In addition, our Noyes Park Pre-Par, PAR and 1st TEENS (advanced level) sessions were offered at a 50% reduced fee as well. The result...individual participation at Noyes Park more than doubled this year!

We are excited about what the future holds for our kids. Our programs are making a difference and parents have taken notice. 92% of the parents who responded to our post-summer survey said that they plan on enrolling their child in a future session. Your investment in the kids of First Tee – Southeast Wisconsin makes these opportunities possible.
